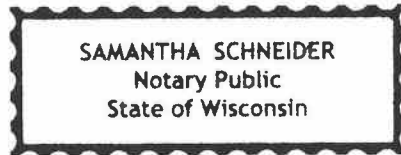

**EXPERT REPORT OF TOM SCHREIBEL REGARDING THE
PROPOSED REDISTRICTNG MAP OF THE CONGRESSMEN**

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EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

My name is Tom Schreibel, and I have been retained as an expert by Intervenor-Petitioners Congressmen Glenn Grothman, Mike Gallagher, Bryan Steil, Tom Tiffany, and Scott Fitzgerald (“the Congressmen”) in the above-captioned case.

My expert report proceeds in four parts:

First, I provide my expert opinions on Wisconsin’s existing congressional map, summarizing and describing the existing districts’ contours; their county and municipality splits; and their general political landscape, where applicable.

Second, I provide my expert opinions regarding Wisconsin’s statewide population changes, as shown in the 2020 Census.

Third, I provide my expert opinions regarding the Congressmen’s proposed remedial map for Wisconsin’s congressional districts (“Proposed Remedial Map”), summarizing and analyzing the changes that it makes to the existing districts. A summary of my expert opinions on this part follows, beginning with District 1 and moving clockwise around the State:

District 1. After the Census, District 1 was underpopulated by 9,337. The Proposed Remedial Map adds these people to District 1 solely by moving the line between Districts 1 and 2, without adjusting any of its boundaries with other districts. This simple change is logical, as District 1

needed to add population, while District 2 needed to shed population.

District 2. After the Census, District 2 was overpopulated by 52,681. After the Proposed Remedial Map's shift of people from District 1 to District 2, I note that the map still needed to remove people from District 2 to reach equal apportionment. The only change to District 2 that the Proposed Remedial Map makes to achieve that result—beyond the adjustment of its boundary with District 1—is to the boundary between Districts 2 and 3. Thus, the map does not disrupt District 2's existing county-line boundaries with Districts 5 or 6. I also note that the map moves all of Richland County into District 3, which is a county that is currently split, and which is generally rural in character. Further, the map moves part of Sauk County into District 3. Thus, the map removes one split county between Districts 2 and 3, replacing it with another. I conclude that this change is logical since it is consistent both with District 3's rural character and with District 2's general orientation around the State's capital city.

District 3. After the 2020 Census, District 3 was underpopulated by 3,082. Given that District 3 received a large number of people from District 2, I note that the Proposed Remedial Map had to remove people from District 3 to reach equal apportionment. The map logically resolves that overpopulation by contracting District 3's northernmost and easternmost extremities, while eliminating four county

splits caused by its long appendage into central Wisconsin. The map's shift of Portage County from District 3 to Districts 7 and 8 is also appropriate and logical. This change not only removed people from District 3 after making its changes to Districts 1 and 2, but it also logically preserved District 3's agricultural and southwestern Wisconsin character.

District 7. After the 2020 Census, District 7 was underpopulated by 4,182. Thus, the Proposed Remedial Map needed to add people to reach equal apportionment. I note that the map accomplishes that reapportionment by adjusting only District 7's boundary with District 3 in a logical manner that results in a net reduction of four county splits. That adjustment added the portion of Portage County occupied by the City of Stevens Point into District 7, which avoided splitting that city between Districts 7 and 8. Further, this is in accord with the makeup of this district, since Stevens Point has common interests with Wausau, which is within District 7's boundaries. This also creates a more sensible line between Districts 3 and 7 that better respects county boundaries. Importantly, these limited changes leave District 7's existing, long boundary with District 8 undisturbed.

District 8. After the 2020 Census, District 8 was overpopulated by 15,252. I note that the Proposed Remedial Map's changes to District 6 ultimately moved more than that amount from District 8, which, in turn, required the addition

of people to District 8 from District 3 to reach equal apportionment. As to District 6, the map transfers people from District 8 in a logical way: the Proposed Remedial Map removes or narrows District 8's appendages into District 6, eliminating a county split and adding historical District 6 areas back to that district. Then, the Proposed Remedial Map adds portions of District 3 to District 8, avoiding a split of Stevens Point.

District 6. After the 2020 Census, District 6 was underpopulated by 8,954. However, District 4's significant underpopulation required District 6 to give people to District 4, despite District 6's own underpopulation. I note that the Proposed Remedial Map eliminates District 6's most southernly extension into Milwaukee County and places it in District 4, a limited and logical change that creates a clean boundary along the northern border of Milwaukee County. The map then addresses District 6's own underpopulation by making logical adjustments to its boundary with District 8. While that change—standing alone—would have caused District 6 to be overpopulated, it was necessary since District 6 was also required to give people to District 5. I conclude that the map thus ultimately reapportions both Districts 6 and 5 simultaneously, adjusting an already-split boundary line between these districts and moving the City of Columbus to District 5. That latter move, while creating a county split, avoids splitting this city.

District 5. After the 2020 Census, District 5 was underpopulated by 1,060; however, I note that District 4's own significant underpopulation required District 5 to move a large number of people to that district. I believe that the Proposed Remedial Map achieves equal population by adding people from District 6, moving more of Dodge County to District 5 from District 6 (which was already split) and adding the City of Columbus. The map does not alter the boundary between Districts 5 and 1, or between Districts 5 and 2, to reach equal apportionment.

District 4. After the Census, District 4 was significantly underpopulated by 41,320. I note that the Proposed Remedial Map logically resolves that underpopulation first by shifting District 5's portion of Wauwatosa roughly east of Interstate 41 to District 4. Then, the Proposed Remedial Map adds the northernmost part of Milwaukee County into District 4 from District 6. Both of these changes result in logical boundaries between districts, and respect District 4's character.

Finally, I summarize the objective metrics comparing the existing congressional map with the Proposed Remedial Map.

QUALIFICATIONS AND REQUIRED DISCLOSURES

1. I, Tom Schreibel, am an expert on the subject of redistricting in Wisconsin, having directly advised Members of Congress in the redistricting process after the 1990, 2000, and 2010 Censuses were completed. In those roles, I

developed expertise in drafting and evaluating Congressional redistricting maps. My work often included hours of work per week, for months at a time, reviewing complex data sets, utilizing redistricting software, and advising Members of Congress from both sides of the aisle on that data. In the redistricting process following the 2000 census, while I was Chief of Staff to Congressman F. James Sensenbrenner, I served as the lead Republican staff member throughout the redistricting process, which resulted in a map with broad support. During that process, I served as the focal point for Members' evaluation of census data and negotiations on the proposed districts. In my over three decades working on redistricting matters, I developed a strong expertise that was heavily relied upon by Members of Congress.

In addition to my direct redistricting work, I have spent over 27 years working for the people of Wisconsin as a staff member for Congress. In my official duties as an aide to a Member of Congress, I worked to address issues and concerns of individuals all across our State for decades. Among the many varied Wisconsin issues that I dealt with over my congressional career, I worked on proposals impacting reformulated gasoline, bird migrations, the Great Lakes Water Compact and other issues impacting Great Lakes water levels, Indian Treaty Rights, and dairy issues—including the Northeast Interstate Dairy Compact. Through this work, I have gained knowledge about communities across

our State and have become an expert on federal issues impacting the people of our State.

I am a life-long Wisconsin resident. I presently reside in the Town of Merton, Wisconsin, and am employed by Michael Best Strategies.

Finally, I have attached my resume as Exhibit 1 to this expert report.

2. I am being paid a flat fee of \$6,000 for my services as an expert in this matter. My compensation is not contingent on the outcome of any claim or case with respect to which my testimony is being offered. I am providing my services in this matter in my personal capacity, unrelated to my other roles, duties, and employment.

3. The Congressmen and their staff provided the factual and data materials that I considered in forming my opinions and in drafting this report. I also had conversations with the Congressmen's staff, who orally relayed facts and data that are themselves reflected in the materials that I received from the Congressmen and their staff. The materials that I considered in forming my expert opinions for this report are as follows:

- The CSV,¹ PDF,² and Shapefile³ formats of the Proposed Remedial Map;
- 2021 Senate Bill 622⁴ and associated drafting files⁵ (both attached as Exhibit 2);
- Joint Stipulation of Facts and Law, *Johnson v. Wis. Elections Comm'n*, No 2021AP1450-OA (Wis. Nov. 4, 2021);

4. Finally, I do not have any publications from the last ten years to disclose. I also have not testified as an expert at trial or by deposition in any case during the previous four years.

STATEMENT OF ALL EXPERT OPINIONS

Below, I first provide my expert opinions regarding Wisconsin's existing Congressional Districts. *Infra* Part I. Next, I provide my expert opinions regarding the statewide population changes in Wisconsin, as shown in the 2020 Census. *Infra* Part II. Then, I provide my expert opinions regarding the Proposed Remedial Map. *Infra* Part III. Finally, I provide a summary of the objective metrics that I used when comparing the existing congressional map to the Proposed Remedial Map. *Infra* Part IV.

I. The Existing Congressional Districts

Wisconsin is divided into eight congressional districts, with each congressional district entitled to elect one

representative in the Congress of the United States. Based on the results of the 2010 Census, Wisconsin's total population was 5,686,986 people, meaning that the ideal population for each congressional district was 710,873 or 710,874 people. The State's 2011 congressional map had equal apportionment across all eight districts when adopted.

A. District 1

District 1 is located in Wisconsin's southeastern corner, where it has been throughout Wisconsin's history. District 1 largely includes mid-sized manufacturing centers and the surrounding areas, and its eastern boundary borders Lake Michigan. District 1 comprises the counties of Kenosha and Racine, as well as parts of the counties of Walworth, Rock, Waukesha, and Milwaukee. Thus, it currently splits four counties. Municipalities in District 1 include the cities of Janesville, Kenosha, Racine, and Burlington. District 1 shares boundaries with Districts 2, 4, and 5. The people in this district generally share similar concerns and challenges related to manufacturing and the use and protection of the Lake Michigan coastline. The population is composed of suburban, rural, and mid-sized communities.

B. District 2

District 2 is in southern Wisconsin, and it contains Wisconsin's capital city of Madison, along with the surrounding areas. District 2 comprises Dane County, Lafayette County, Green County, Sauk County, and Iowa County, as well as parts of the counties of Rock and Richland.

Therefore, District 2 currently splits two counties. Municipalities in District 2 include Madison, Monona, Middleton, Sun Prairie, and Beloit. District 2 shares borders with Districts 1, 3, 5, and 8. The life and activity of Madison as a growing city and state capital, as well as the University of Wisconsin, broadly define this district's character.

C. District 3

District 3 is in the southwestern corner of the State, largely following the eastern shore the Mississippi River. District 3 comprises the counties of Portage, Adams, Grant, Crawford, Vernon, La Crosse, Trempealeau, Buffalo, Eau Claire, Dunn, and Pierce, as well as parts of the counties of Juneau, Monroe, Jackson, Richland, and Chippewa. District 3, therefore, currently splits 5 counties. District 3's largest municipalities include Eau Claire and La Crosse in the west and—due to this district's long, narrow appendage into central Wisconsin—Stevens Point. District 3 shares a border with District 2, 6, 7, and 8. District 3 is centered in the western portions of the State, and it is often referred to as the "Driftless Region." It is more rural and agricultural in character.

D. District 4

District 4 is centered in Wisconsin's largest municipality, the City of Milwaukee, in southeast Wisconsin. District 4 comprises parts of the counties of Milwaukee and Waukesha (a very small portion of the City of Milwaukee extends into Waukesha County), so it splits two counties. The

largest municipalities here are the cities of Milwaukee, South Milwaukee, Shorewood and Whitefish Bay. District 4 borders Districts 1, 5, and 6. District 4 is Wisconsin's only majority-minority district. It is also Wisconsin's most urban and densely populated district.

E. District 5

District 5 is located towards Wisconsin's southeastern corner and has Milwaukee's northwest and western suburbs as its core. District 5 covers the counties of Jefferson and Washington, as well as parts of the counties of Dodge, Waukesha, Walworth, and Milwaukee. It splits four counties. District 5's municipalities include Menomonee Falls, Waukesha, West Bend, Oconomowoc, Greenfield, Brookfield, and Watertown. District 5 borders Districts 1, 2, 4, and 6. Owing to its proximity to Milwaukee, District 5's character is largely suburban and ex-urban.

F. District 6

District 6 is in eastern and central Wisconsin and, as it has for decades, it includes many small and mid-sized cities and villages with a focus on manufacturing and dairy. District 6 borders Lake Michigan on its long, eastern boundary. District 6 contains the counties of Manitowoc, Waushara, Marquette, Green Lake, Columbia, Fond du Lac, Ozaukee, and Sheboygan, as well as parts of the counties of Winnebago, Dodge, and Milwaukee. This district splits three counties. District 6's municipalities include Sheboygan, Manitowoc, Fond du Lac, Oshkosh, Portage, and Two Rivers.

District 6 borders Districts 2, 3, 4, 5, and 8. Like District 1, the people of District 6 generally have an interest in manufacturing, as well as the use and protection of the coast of Lake Michigan.

G. District 7

District 7 contains much of what is often referred to as “up north” Wisconsin, with its northern border along Lake Superior and its southern border reaching down to encompass much of the central region of the State. District 7 is Wisconsin’s largest district geographically. District 7 contains many counties, specifically St. Croix, Polk, Burnett, Barron, Washburn, Douglas, Bayfield, Ashland, Iron, Sawyer, Price, Rusk Taylor, Clark, Marathon, Lincoln, Oneida, Vilas, Florence, Forest, and Langlade, as well as parts of the counties of Chippewa, Jackson, Juneau, Monroe, and Wood. District 7 splits five counties. The district’s municipalities include Wausau, Marshfield, Rhinelander, and Hudson. District 7 shares a border with Districts 3, 6, and 8. District 7’s vast area includes many of Wisconsin’s lakes and forests. Many of northern Wisconsin’s industries—including forest products and tourism—are based on those natural resources, giving this district its distinct character.

H. District 8

District 8 is Wisconsin’s northeast region, comprising much of the Green Bay and Fox Valley media market. District 8 contains the counties of Marinette, Oconto, Menominee, Shawano, Waupaca, Outagamie, Calumet,

Brown, Kewaunee, and Door, as well as part of Winnebago County. It splits only a single county. District 8's municipalities include Green Bay, Appleton, Sturgeon Bay, Kewaunee, Kaukauna, Shawano, De Pere, and Marinette. District 8 shares a border with Districts 3 and 6—as well as a long border with District 7, which roughly tracks the line between the Wausau and Green Bay media markets. The district has an emphasis on manufacturing, including shipbuilding and papermaking, and it includes agricultural areas as well.

II. Summary Of The 2020 Census Findings' Impact On The Existing Congressional Map

In general, the 2020 Census found that the state population grew by 3.6%, to 5,893,718; however, that growth was not evenly distributed across the State. The Madison area saw significant growth, with Dane County growing by approximately 15%. Meanwhile, the population of the City of Milwaukee dropped by approximately 17,000. As a result of these population swings, District 4 needs to gain 41,320 people, while District 2 needs to shed 52,681, in order to reach the constitutional requirements for equal population. The population shifts in other districts were less dramatic: District 1 needs to add 9,337, District 3 needs to add 3,082, District 5 needs to add 1,060, District 6 needs to add 8,954, District 7 needs to add 4,182, and District 8 needs to shed 15,252.

Given these population shifts, all four of the districts currently covering Milwaukee County are required to expand to reach equal population. Districts 7 and 3 in the north and west will also need to expand. Districts 2 and 8, based in Madison and Green Bay, respectively, need to contract.

III. The Proposed Congressional Districts

Based on my independent, expert review, I conclude that the Proposed Remedial Map achieves equal reapportionment with perfect population equality between Wisconsin's eight congressional districts. Specifically, Districts 2, 3, 5, 6, 7, and 8 have 736,715 people, while Districts 1 and 4 have 736,714 people.

Further, based on my study, I conclude that the Proposed Remedial Map makes only limited, logical changes to the existing congressional map in order to reach equal reapportionment. According to the December 13 LRB Memo, Ex. 3, the Proposed Remedial Map moves only 384,456 individuals into new congressional districts.¹⁰ As a result, the Proposed Remedial Map has a core retention of 93.48%, which means that it changes only 6.52% of the individuals from the existing congressional map (384,456 people moved, divided by the 5,893,718 total population). Further, the December 15 LRB memo, Ex. 4, explains that the Proposed Remedial Map

splits only 10 counties, while the existing map split 12; and it splits only 16 municipalities, compared to the existing map's 27.

Based off the existing maps, the above-stated population shifts found by the 2020 Census necessitates a shift in congressional districts expanding out from the Milwaukee area, while districts across the State in general must move towards Madison and Green Bay.

As I review the Proposed Remedial Map in its entirety, I conclude that it properly accounts for those population shifts. As the population swings would indicate, the proposed maps of Milwaukee-area districts move west, towards Madison and north towards Green Bay. Likewise, Districts 3 and 7 move south, towards Madison's population growth. It is my opinion that the Proposed Remedial Map's limited changes are highly consistent with a least-changes approach, based off the existing congressional map.

Below, I provide my expert opinions on the Proposed Remedial Map's necessary changes to the existing map, due to findings of the 2020 Census. I first summarize the necessary changes that the Proposed Remedial Map makes as a result of population shifts in the State. Then, I analyze those changes. My summary and analysis begin with District 1 and proceed clockwise around the State, ending with District 4.

A. District 1

1. Summary Of Changes

After the 2020 Census, District 1 was underpopulated by 9,337 people. The Proposed Remedial Map adds these people to District 1 solely by moving the line between District 1 and District 2 farther into the existing District 2, without adjusting any of its other boundaries. This change in the Proposed Remedial Map also shifted a small number of people from District 1 into District 2 in Rock County; however, I believe that this change was necessary to reach equal apportionment without splitting additional municipalities. The Proposed Remedial Map's adjustment adds more of the surrounding Janesville area into District 1, a city that has historically been located in this district. Further, since the existing border between District 1 and District 2 already splits Rock County—and since the Proposed Remedial Map does not make any other changes to District 1—the Proposed Remedial Map equally reapportions District 1 without splitting any new counties.

2. Analysis Of Changes

I conclude that the Proposed Remedial Map makes limited, logical changes to District 1 to reach equal reapportionment. After the Census, District 1 required an additional 9,337 people. The Proposed Remedial Map adds those people to District 1 solely by altering its boundary with District 2—which is overpopulated—adding more of the surrounding Janesville area as needed to achieve equal

reapportionment. This alteration does not split any new counties—as the only adjusted boundary crosses Rock County. Further, since Janesville has historically fallen within District 1, this is a logical alteration that preserves the current makeup and character of this district. District 1 experiences minimal change, only adding the required number individuals from the only district that it borders that is overpopulated.

B. District 2

1. Summary Of Changes

After the 2020 Census, District 2 was overpopulated by 52,681 people, making it by far Wisconsin's largest-growing district over this past decade. After the Proposed Remedial Map's shift of people from District 1 to District 2, I note that the Proposed Remedial Map still needed to remove people from District 2 to reach equal apportionment. The only change to District 2 that the Proposed Remedial Map makes to achieve that result—beyond the adjustment of its boundary with District 1, described above—is to the boundary between District 2 and District 3. Thus, the Proposed Remedial Map does not disrupt District 2's boundaries with District 5 and District 6. The boundary lines with Districts 5 and 6 remain straight county lines.

As for the change to the line between Districts 2 and 3, I note that the Proposed Remedial Map moves the remainder of Richland County into District 3, which is a county that is currently split between these districts. Richland County is

generally rural in character and shares much in common with District 3. The Proposed Remedial Map also moves part of Sauk County into District 3. Thus, the Proposed Remedial Map removes one split county between District 2 and District 3, replacing it with another.

2. Analysis Of Changes

I conclude that the Proposed Remedial Map makes limited, logical changes to District 2 to reach equal reapportionment. As a result of the Census, District 2 was overpopulated by 52,681 people, easily qualifying it as Wisconsin's largest-growing district. Therefore, District 2 needed to contract considerably in size to achieve equal apportionment. So, to reach an equal population in District 2, the Proposed Remedial Map first makes a limited, logical adjustment to District 2's boundary with District 1, already explained above. Then, the Proposed Remedial Map changes only District 2's boundary with District 3, and only as necessary to achieve equal reapportionment. Specifically, the Proposed Remedial Map moves all of Richland County into District 3, as well as part of Sauk County—which, I conclude, is a logical adjustment since it is consistent both with District 3's rural character and District 2's general orientation around the State's capital city and the University of Wisconsin.

C. District 3

1. Summary Of Changes

After the 2020 Census, District 3 was underpopulated by 3,082 people. Given that District 3 received a large number of people from District 2's growth, as discussed immediately above, I note that the Proposed Remedial Map had to remove people from District 3 to reach equal apportionment. To do so, the Proposed Remedial Map contracts District 3 at its most northern and eastern extremities, while also eliminating four county splits due to the long appendage in the existing District 3. For the northern extremities, the Proposed Remedial Map moves District 3's portion of Chippewa County into District 7—eliminating that county split—along with the most northern portion of Dunn County. For the eastern extremities, the Proposed Remedial Map moves the City of Stevens Point and the surrounding areas in Portage County to its north and west to District 7 and then—in a change that removes four county splits from District 3's long appendage—moves the District 7 portions of the counties of Jackson, Juneau, Monroe, and Wood to District 3, along with all of Clark County. Finally, the Proposed Remedial Map moves the remainder of Portage County into District 8, as discussed more fully below. Overall, the Proposed Remedial Map eliminates six county splits in District 3 (Chippewa, Jackson, Juneau, Monroe, Wood Counties and—per the changes to District 2, above—Richland County), while adding back only two, Sauk and Dunn.

2. Analysis Of Changes

I conclude that the Proposed Remedial Map makes limited, logical changes to District 3 to reach equal reapportionment. While District 3 was slightly underpopulated after the Census, the limited changes that the Proposed Remedial Map made to District 2 resulted in an overpopulation of District 3. The Proposed Remedial Map resolves that resulting overpopulation in District 3 in an exceedingly logical way. Specifically, it contracts District 3's northernmost and easternmost extremities, while eliminating four of the county splits caused by its long appendage into central Wisconsin.

I also note in particular that the Proposed Remedial Map's shift of Portage County from District 3 to Districts 7 and 8 is appropriate and logical. To begin, this change moved District 3 toward equal apportionment, as the Proposed Remedial Map had to remove people from District 3 after making its changes to Districts 1 and 2. Further, the change logically preserved District 3's political geography as a district centered in western Wisconsin. District 3 is a predominantly rural, western district; however, Stevens Point is a municipality firmly within central Wisconsin—located at the end of District 3's narrow, multiple-county-splitting appendage. Stevens Point has a great deal in common with District 7's Wausau's which, like Stevens Point, has a history as a forest-products producer in Central Wisconsin located on the Wisconsin River. Indeed, Stevens Point and Wausau not

only share similar industries and a Wisconsin River location, but also share the same television market, helping to improve communications within a congressional district. By removing the northern and western extremities of District 3, the Proposed Remedial Map does precisely what is to be expected by the Census data, in that it moves the district closer toward growing Madison.

D. District 7

1. Summary Of Changes

After the 2020 Census, District 7 was underpopulated by 4,182 people. Based on my review, I conclude that the Proposed Remedial Map accomplishes that reapportionment by adjusting only District 7's border with District 3, as explained above. That adjustment added the portion of Portage County occupied by the City of Stevens Point and the surrounding areas into District 7, which avoids splitting that city between District 7 and District 8. Given that the Proposed Remedial Map only alters the District 7/District 3 boundary, District 7's long border with District 8 remains completely unchanged.

2. Analysis Of Changes

I conclude that the Proposed Remedial Map makes limited, logical changes to District 7 to reach equal reapportionment. As discussed immediately above, the Proposed Remedial Map reaches that target solely by adjusting District 7's boundary with District 3 in a logical

manner that results in a net reduction of four county splits. This also creates a more sensible line between Districts 3 and 7 that better respects county boundaries. And these limited changes leave District 7's existing, long boundary with District 8 undisturbed. Further, as explained above, the map's addition of Stevens Point accords with the general makeup of this district, since Stevens Point is located near—and has considerable common interests with—Wausau, a city within District 7's boundaries.

E. District 8

1. Summary Of Changes

After the 2020 Census, District 8 was overpopulated by 15,252 people, making it Wisconsin's second-fastest growing district. The Proposed Remedial Map's changes to District 6 ultimately moved more than that amount from District 8, which, in turn, required adding people to District 8 from District 3. Specifically, as for the change with District 6 to lose population in District 8, the Proposed Remedial Map adjusts District 8's southern border with District 6 in two respects. First, it eliminates all of District 8's small appendage in Winnebago County, thus eliminating a county split. Then, it eliminates most of its southernmost appendage comprising Calumet County, a county historically located within District 6. Although that latter change continues the split of the City of Appleton between these districts, Appleton is already split among Winnebago, Calumet, and Outagamie Counties. The Proposed Remedial Map places all of the

Winnebago and Calumet portions of Appleton within District 6, with the Outagamie portion remaining in District 8. As for the change with District 3 to add population, the Proposed Remedial Map places southern and eastern portions of Portage County within District 8, which adds the people ultimately required by District 8 while avoiding splitting Stevens Point.

2. Analysis Of Changes

I conclude that the Proposed Remedial Map makes limited, logical changes to District 8 to reach equal reapportionment. After the Census, District 8 was overpopulated by 15,252 people, making it Wisconsin's second-largest growing district in this past decade. However, the changes needed by District 3—which had to add people from the overpopulated District 2—moved more people than District 7 could take while still achieving equal population. As a result, it was logical to add the additional excess population from District 3 to District 8.

As to District 8's changes with District 6, the Proposed Remedial Map transfers people from District 8 in a logical way: it eliminates District 8's appendage in Winnebago County, thereby eliminating a county split. Then, it eliminates most of District 8's appendage made up of Calumet County, a county that has historically been in District 6.

F. District 6

1. Summary Of Changes

After the 2020 Census, District 6 was underpopulated by 8,954 people. However, due to District 4's significant underpopulation, District 4 required additional people from neighboring districts. As will be discussed in greater detail below, District 4 adds people from both District 5 and District 6. Accordingly, I note that the Proposed Remedial Map removes District 6's most southern extension into Milwaukee County and places it in District 4, creating a clean boundary line following Milwaukee County's northern border. To address District 6's underpopulation, then, my review shows that the Proposed Remedial Map added people to District 6 from District 8. Those adjustments, standing alone, would have caused District 6 to be overpopulated. In my opinion, however, this was necessary to shift more people to District 5, a neighbor of District 4, which also had to give to District 4 despite its own underpopulation. So, to reach equal apportionment for District 6—and, simultaneously, District 5—the Proposed Remedial Map first removes a portion of Dodge County from District 6 and places it in District 5, adjusting an already-split county line. Then, it gives District 6's portion of the City of Columbus to District 5, which—while creating a county split—removes the existing split of that municipality. The Proposed Remedial Map does not make any alterations to District 6's existing western

border with District 3, as the foregoing adjustments resulted in equal apportionment.

2. Analysis Of Changes

I conclude that the Proposed Remedial Map makes limited, logical changes to District 6 to reach equal reapportionment. After the 2020 Census, District 6 was underpopulated by 8,954 people. However, due to District 4's significant underpopulation, District 4 required additional people from District 6—despite its own underpopulation. Accordingly, the Proposed Remedial Map eliminates District 6's most southern extension into Milwaukee County and places it in District 4, a limited and logical change that creates a clean boundary along the northern border of Milwaukee County. The Proposed Remedial Map then addresses District 6's own underpopulation by making logical adjustments to its boundary with District 8, as described above. And while those adjustments would have caused District 6 to be overpopulated, standing alone, they were necessary in order to ultimately shift people to the neighboring District 5—a district that was also compelled to give to District 4, despite its own underpopulation. So, to reach District 6's final state of equal apportionment—and to equally apportion District 5 as well, as also explained above—the Proposed Remedial Map first removes a portion of Dodge County from District 6 and places it in District 5, utilizing an already-split county line. Then, it gives District 6's portion of the City of Columbus to District 5, which—while creating a

county split—removes the existing split of that municipality. Since these adjustments resulted in an equal population, the Proposed Remedial Map does not make any alterations to District 6's existing western border with District 3.

G. District 5

1. Summary Of Changes

After the 2020 Census, District 5 was slightly underpopulated, by 1,060 people. However, I note that the neighboring District 4 is significantly underpopulated, requiring District 5 to lose people to that district. The Proposed Map thus splits the City of Wauwatosa between District 5 and District 4. Then, to achieve an equal population in District 5, the Proposed Map adds people from District 6 and moving more of Dodge County to District 5 from District 6 (a county that was already split), while also adding the City of Columbus. Those changes between Districts 5 and 6 do not create any new county or municipal splits. Further, the Proposed Remedial Map does not alter the boundary between District 5 and District 1, or between District 5 and District 2, to reach equal apportionment.

2. Analysis Of Changes

I conclude that the Proposed Remedial Map makes limited, logical changes to District 5 to reach equal reapportionment. While District 5 was underpopulated by 1,060 people after the 2020 Census, it had to give a significant amount of people to District 4, owing to its own substantial

underpopulation. The shift from District 5 to District 4 in the Proposed Remedial Map occurs entirely in the City of Wauwatosa. The easternmost portions of Wauwatosa that the Proposed Remedial Map gives to District 4 are logical, as they immediately abut District 4's current boundary, as further explained below. Given this shift to District 4, District 5 ultimately required the addition of people to reach equal apportionment. As already explained above, the Proposed Remedial Map achieves that result solely by adding population from District 6. Specifically, the Proposed Remedial Map moves more of the already-split Dodge County to District 5 from District 6, and then it adds the remaining portions of the already-split City of Columbus—thus ending that municipal split. These changes did not create any new county splits. Since those limited changes result in an equal population, the Proposed Remedial Map does not adjust District 5's boundaries with District 1 or District 2 in any manner.

H. District 4

1. Summary Of Changes

Finally, after the 2020 Census, District 4 was underpopulated by 41,320 people—by far the largest population decline among Wisconsin's districts. I note that the Proposed Remedial Map adds more of Milwaukee's surrounding urban areas to District 4 to eliminate this substantial population deficit. Specifically, the Proposed Remedial Map adds the eastern portion of the City of

Wauwatosa to District 4 from District 5. Although this change splits Wauwatosa, the new boundary line roughly follows Interstate 41, which itself divides Wauwatosa. Finally, I note that the Proposed Remedial Map then adds the northernmost portion of Milwaukee County into District 4 from District 6, creating a clean boundary that completes District 4's reapportionment.

2. Analysis Of Changes

I conclude that the Proposed Remedial Map makes limited, logical changes to District 4 to reach equal reapportionment. After the Census, District 4 was significantly underpopulated, by 41,320 people, which is easily the largest population shortfall in any district in Wisconsin. The Proposed Remedial Map makes up that significant shortfall in a logical and tailored way—adding people solely from Milwaukee's surrounding suburbs, in a manner that does not result in any new county splits. Specifically, as already mentioned above, the Proposed Remedial Map adds eastern portions of the City of Wauwatosa to District 4 from District 5 roughly along Interstate 41, resulting in a common-sense boundary between these districts in the process. While this change does split Wauwatosa, Interstate 41 itself separates this city. Then, to complete District 4's reapportionment, the Proposed Remedial Map adds the northernmost part of Milwaukee County into District 4 from District 6, again resulting in a clean boundary. Indeed, this change ends District 6's split of

Milwaukee County, leaving this exceedingly populous county split only between Districts 4 and 5. Finally, and overall, these changes preserve this district's densely populated character.

IV. Summary Of Objective Metrics Comparing The Existing Congressional Map And The Proposed Remedial Map

In this final section, I provide a summary of the objective metrics that I used to compare the existing congressional map to the Proposed Remedial Map, many of which I already discussed in Parts I and III of this expert report. This summary proceeds as follows: (A) the population changes across the two maps; (B) a comparison of the county splits between the two maps; and (C) a comparison of the municipal splits between the two maps.

A. Population Changes

The 2010 Census shows that Wisconsin's total population was 5,686,986. This meant that the ideal population for each of Wisconsin's eight congressional districts was 710,873 or 710,874.

The 2020 Census showed that Wisconsin's total population grew to 5,893,718, an increase of 206,732 people. With this total population, the ideal population for each of Wisconsin's eight congressional districts is now 736,714 or 736,715 people.

According to the December 13 LRB Memo, Ex. 3, the Proposed Remedial Map moves only 384,456 people into new

congressional districts. As a result, the Proposed Remedial Map has a core retention of 93.48%, which means that it changes only 6.52% of the population of the existing congressional map, as referenced in Part III, above.

B. Comparison Of County Splits

As indicated by the December 15 LRB Memo, Ex. 4, the Proposed Remedial Map has fewer county splits than the existing congressional map. According to LRB, the existing congressional map had 12 county splits, while the Proposed Remedial Map has 10 county splits. The December 15 LRB Memo, Ex. 4, delineates each of these splits on a county-by-county basis.¹¹

C. Comparison Of Municipal Splits

According to the Legislative Reference Bureau Memo dated December 14, the Proposed Remedial Map has fewer municipal splits than the existing congressional map. That memo indicates the existing congressional map splits 27 municipalities while the Proposed Remedial Map splits only 16 municipalities. The attached December 15 LRB Memo, Ex. 4, delineates each of these municipal splits on a county-by-county basis.¹²

¹¹ Note, county splits may be measured using multiple methods, producing different results, as LRB itself shows. *See* Ex. 3. For example, some methods do not include county splits when there is only a geographic split, affecting no population within the split area. Also, a county split more than two ways could be counted as one split, or multiple splits.

¹² Note, like county splits, municipal splits may be measured using multiple methods, producing different results. Further, with

municipalities currently undergoing the redistricting process themselves, calculations utilizing live databases can produce different results based on the times that the measurements are run and when local communities enact redistricting. For example, the December 13 LRB Memo, Ex. 3, finds that the existing map had 35 municipal splits, while the Proposed Remedial Map had 28 municipal splits. This is likely due to different methods used to calculate splits.

2021 WISCONSIN ACT

AN ACT *to repeal and recreate* 3.11 to 3.18 of the statutes; **relating to:** congressional redistricting.

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

SECTION 1. 3.11 to 3.18 of the statutes are repealed and recreated to read:

3.11 First congressional district. All of the following territory constitutes the first congressional district:

- (1) **WHOLE COUNTIES.** Kenosha and Racine.
- (2) **MILWAUKEE COUNTY.** That part of Milwaukee County consisting of all of the following:
 - (a) The villages of Greendale and Hales Corners.
 - (b) The cities of Franklin and Oak Creek.
- (3) **ROCK COUNTY.** That part of Rock County consisting of all of the following:
 - (a) The towns of Bradford, Clinton, Harmony, Janesville, Johnstown, La Prairie, Lima, Milton, and Rock.
 - (b) That part of the town of Turtle comprising U.S. census tract 2602, blocks 1000, 1001, 1002, 1003, 1004, 1005, 1010, 1011, 1012, 1013, 1014, 1015, 1016, 1018, 1019, 1020, 1021, 1022, 1023, 1024, 1025, 1026, 1027, 1028, 1029, 1030, 1031, 1032, 1033, 1034, 1035, 1036, 1037, 1038, 1039, 1040, 1041, 1042, 1043, 1044, 1045, 1047, 2000, 2001, 2002, 2003, 2004, 2005, 2006, 2007, 2008, 2009, 2014, 2103, 2104, 2105, 2106, 2108, 2109, 2114, 2115, 2116, 2117, 2118, 2119, 2120, 2121, 2122, 2123, 2124, 2125, 2126, 2127, 2129, 2130, 2131, 2132, and 2141.
 - (c) The village of Clinton.

(d) The cities of Janesville and Milton.

(4) **WALWORTH COUNTY.** That part of Walworth County consisting of all of the following:

(a) The towns of Bloomfield, Darien, Delavan, East Troy, Geneva, La Grange, Lafayette, Linn, Lyons, Richmond, Sharon, Spring Prairie, Sugar Creek, Troy, and Walworth.

(b) That part of the town of Whitewater comprising U.S. census tract 301, blocks 3001, 3002, 3003, 3004, 3006, 3007, 3008, 3009, 3010, 3011, 3014, 3015, 3016, 3017, 3018, 3021, 3022, 3023, 3024, 3025, 3026, 3027, 3028, 3029, 3030, 3033, 3034, 3036, 3037, 3038, 3039, 3040, 3041, 3042, 3043, 3044, 3045, 3046, 3047, 3048, 3049, 3050, 3051, 3052, 4000, 4001, 4002, 4003, 4004, 4005, 4006, 4007, 4008, 4009, 4010, 4011, 4012, 4016, 4017, 4018, 4019, 4020, 4021, 4022, 4023, 4024, 4027, 4029, 4030, 4031, 4032, and 4033; and tract 400, blocks 2051, 2053, 2057, 2058, 2060, 4020, and 4021; and tract 502, blocks 1028, 1029, 1030, 1034, and 1036.

(f) The cities of Delavan, Elkhorn, and Lake Geneva.

* Section 991.11, WISCONSIN STATUTES: Effective date of acts. "Every act and every portion of an act enacted by the legislature over the governor's partial veto which does not expressly prescribe the time when it takes effect shall take effect on the day after its date of publication."

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(g) That part of the city of Whitewater comprising U.S. census tract 400, blocks 2021 and 2054.

(h) That part of the city of Burlington located in the county.

(5) WAUKESHA COUNTY. That part of Waukesha County consisting of all of the following:

(a) The towns of Eagle, Genesee, Mukwonago, Ottawa, and Vernon.

Compactness

Compactness, in the redistricting context, refers to the "tightness" of a district's geometric shape. 2011 WISCONSIN ACT 44

AN ACT *to amend* 3.002 (1m) and 3.004 (2); and *to repeal and recreate* 3.11 to 3.18 of the statutes; **relating to** congressional redistricting.

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

SECTION 1. 3.002 (1m) of the statutes is amended to read:

3.002 (1m) Reference to any county or municipality means that county or municipality as its boundaries exist on ~~August~~ April 1 of the year following of the federal decennial census on which the districting plan described under subch. II is based.

SECTION 2. 3.004 (2) of the statutes is amended to read:

3.004 (2) "Ward" means a ~~municipal ward in effect on August 1 of the year following the federal decennial census on which prescribed by a municipality based upon municipal boundaries in effect on April 1 of the year of the federal decennial census in accordance with the most recent revision of municipal wards under s. 5.15 upon which~~ the districting plan described under subch. II is based.

SECTION 3. 3.11 to 3.18 of the statutes are repealed and recreated to read:

3.11 First congressional district. All of the following territory constitutes the first congressional district:

(1) **WHOLE COUNTIES.** Kenosha and Racine.

(2) **MILWAUKEE COUNTY.** That part of Milwaukee County consisting of all of the following:

(a) The villages of Greendale and Hales Corners.

(b) The cities of Franklin and Oak Creek.

(3) **ROCK COUNTY.** That part of Rock County consisting of all of the following:

(a) The towns of Bradford, Clinton, Johnstown, and Lima.

Detail Maps, Chippewa County



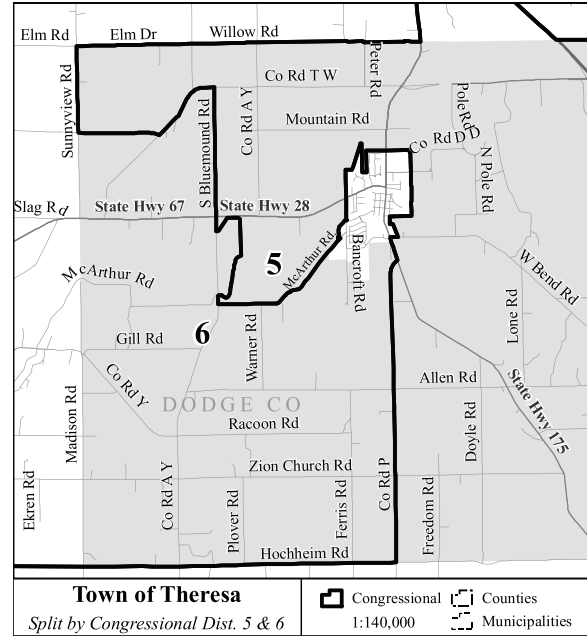
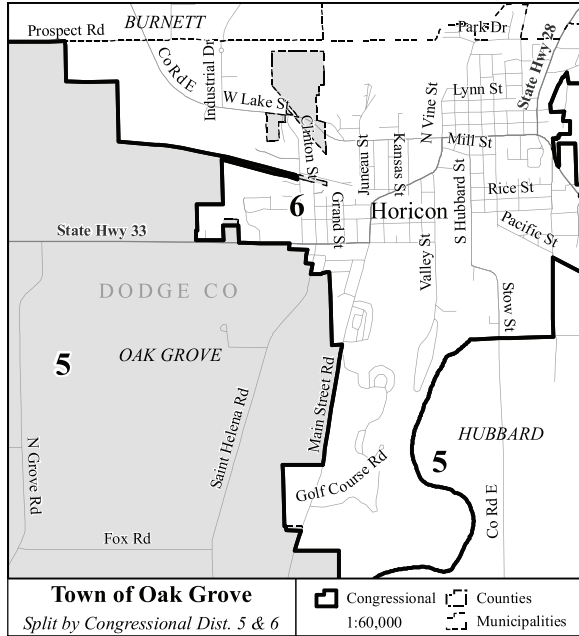

Detail Maps, Dodge County

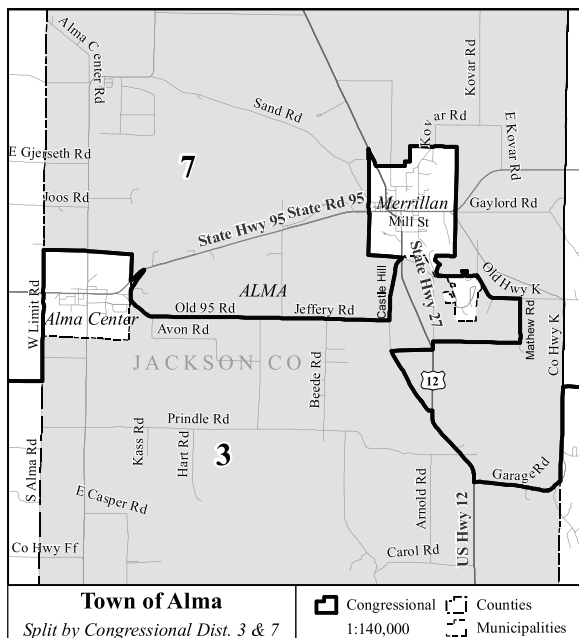

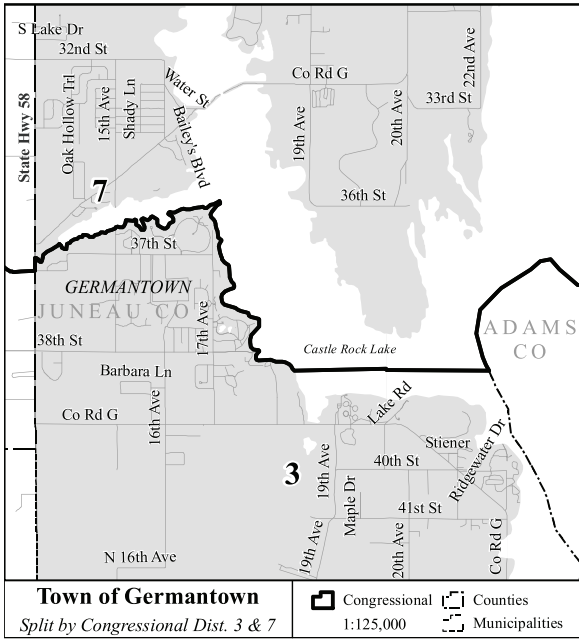
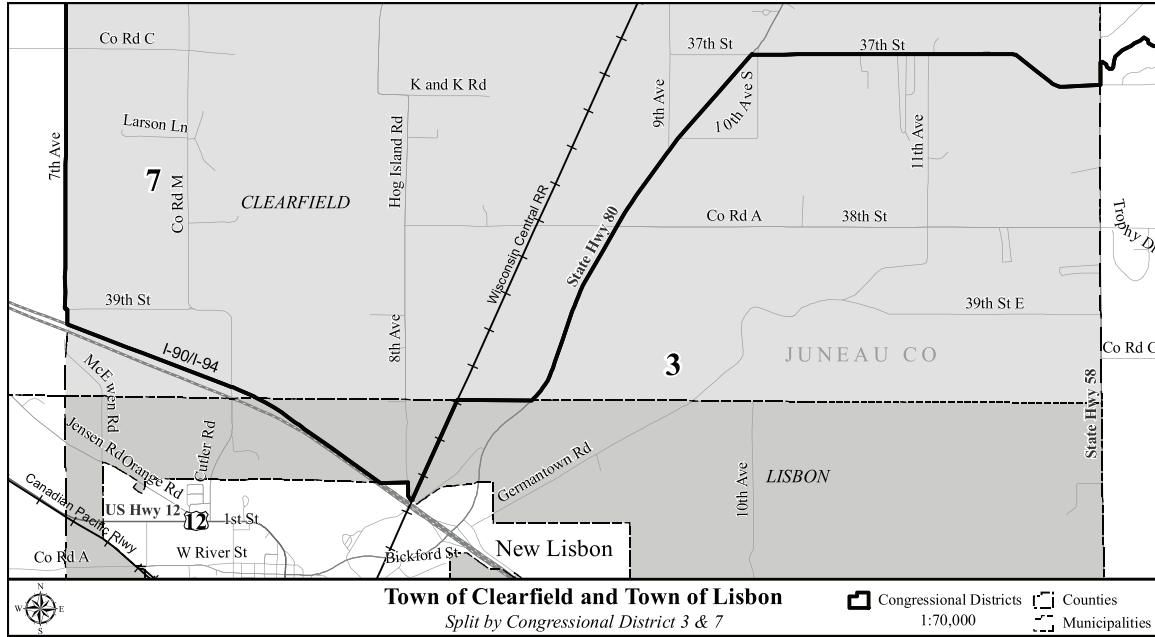

Detail Map, Jackson County

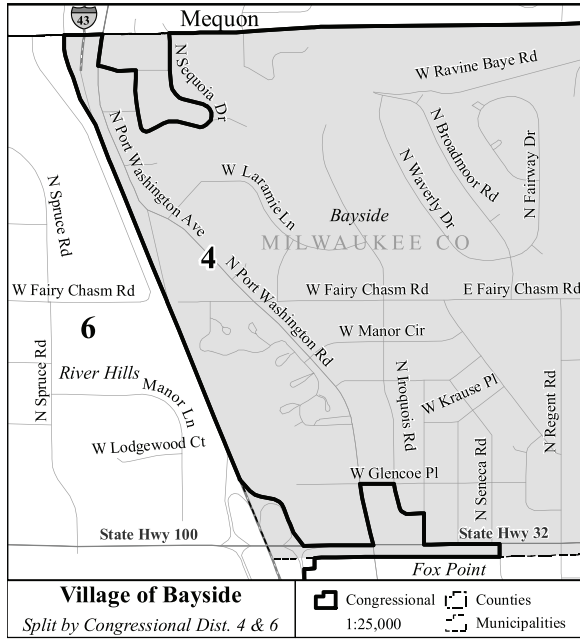

The fight over Wisconsin's next congressional map, and what it means for the two parties

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The redistricting plan passed by the GOP-controlled Legislature in recent days would give Republicans a lock on five of Wisconsin's eight U.S. House seats and a good likelihood of winning a sixth.

That 6-2 GOP advantage stands in contrast to a rival plan drafted by the governor's redistricting commission, which in most cases would result in either a 4-4 split or a 5-3 Republican edge (which is the current breakdown).

These are the two leading proposals for how to redraw the congressional lines in Wisconsin for the next 10 years.

One map is the product of Republicans who control the Legislature. The other comes from the commission established by Democrat Tony Evers and has support from many Democratic state lawmakers.

The final boundaries are expected to be settled in court.

But a closer look at these two plans underscores what's at stake politically.

Is there any common ground between the two plans?

Yes. Both plans envision two safe Democratic seats and four safe GOP seats. The safe Democratic seats are the same ones we have today: the 2nd District that includes Madison and is represented by Mark Pocan and the 4th District that includes Milwaukee and is represented by Gwen Moore.

The four safe GOP seats in both plans are also safe Republican seats today: the 7th in northern Wisconsin, represented by Tom Tiffany; the 8th in northeastern Wisconsin,

represented by Mike Gallagher; the 6th in east-central Wisconsin, represented by Glenn Grothman; and the 5th on the suburban periphery of Milwaukee, represented by Scott Fitzgerald.

The political tilt of these six districts reflects the political geography of Wisconsin: high concentrations of Democratic voters in Milwaukee and Dane counties; and a preponderance of Republican voters in the outer suburbs of Milwaukee and across the more rural regions of central and northern Wisconsin.

Where do the maps most differ?

The key differences involve the 1st District in southern Wisconsin and the 3rd in western Wisconsin.

This is no surprise. These two are currently the state's most competitive seats. Because these are regions that combine red and blue turf, their partisan lean can be altered by additions here or subtractions there. Short of a fundamental makeover of the map, this is where the action is in congressional redistricting.

The 1st, represented by Republican Bryan Steil and Paul Ryan before him, includes the Democratic cities of Kenosha, Racine and Janesville and a swath of Republican exurbs and small towns southeast of Milwaukee.

The 3rd, represented since 1997 by Democrat Ron Kind, includes the Democratic cities of La Crosse, Eau Claire and Stevens Point and also rural areas that range from purple to red.

The 1st is the most competitive of the five House districts currently held by the GOP. But it is not a 50/50 seat: it has about a 10-point Republican lean.

The 3rd is currently the state's only true swing seat. Democrat Barack Obama carried it twice, as did Republican Donald Trump. It has historically contained the most "purple" rural counties in the state. Many of them voted Democratic for president in the 1990s, 2000s and early 2010s, but have grown redder since. Trump won the district by almost five points last year. Kind got reelected in 2020 by just two points against GOP challenger Derrick Van Orden and plans to retire in January.

How does the GOP plan approach these two key districts?

The Republican plan leaves the 1st mostly unchanged and politically safe for the GOP.

It makes the 3rd about two or three points more Republican than it is now. That is a modest but potentially crucial change. That shift is roughly equal to the margin by which Republicans lost this congressional seat last year.

Raising the stakes even more, this is very likely to be one of the most hotly contested U.S. House races in the nation in 2022. The GOP plan makes the district a little redder by altering its boundaries in central Wisconsin, including moving the blue city of Stevens Point out of the 3rd and into the 7th district.

To calculate the political lean of each district under these plans, we relied on an analysis by John Johnson of the Marquette University Law School that calculated the average top-of-the-ticket vote over the three most competitive, high-stakes statewide elections in recent years: the races for president in 2016 and 2020 and for governor in 2018. These very tight contests reflect Wisconsin's underlying 50/50 partisan divide.

Using this measure, the 1st would have a 9.8-point GOP lean under the Republican plan, meaning you'd expect Republicans to carry the district by that amount if the vote for Congress followed the district's partisan tilt in competitive statewide races. The 3rd would have a GOP lean of 5 points under the Republican plan, up from 2.4 points currently.

How does the plan by the governor's commission approach these two districts?

In the case of the 3rd, the commission's plan would make the seat about three to four points more Democratic than it is today, leaving it slightly bluer than the state as a whole. The district would remain the state's top battleground seat but would have a small Democratic tilt instead of a small Republican tilt. The commission's map does this by extending the 3rd eastward into purple and marginally blue turf that is now part of Pocan's 2nd District, including Green and Sauk counties.

In the case of the 1st, the commission's plan makes more far-reaching changes, shifting the district from about a 10-point GOP lean to about a 5-point Democratic lean. It does this in

several ways. It moves the Democratic city of Beloit back into the district (Beloit used to be part of the 1st but was pushed just outside its borders two decades ago). It cuts out the southern half of Waukesha County (very Republican turf). And it extends the district farther north in Milwaukee County, into the south side of the city of Milwaukee.

So how does each party fare under the two plans?

In a 50/50 election year (where there are equal numbers of people voting for each party statewide), Republicans would easily win five and most likely six of the eight seats under the GOP plan.

Under the commission plan backed by Democrats, the most likely outcomes are either a 4-4 split or 5-3 edge for Republicans.

While the Republican plan is similar to the current lines that were adopted by the GOP-controlled Legislature 10 years ago, there is one key difference: It increases the odds of Republicans gaining a sixth seat by making the most competitive district (the 3rd) redder.

Under the commission plan that was backed by Democrats in the state Senate, Democrats would be favored to win four of eight seats in a 50/50 election year, but only narrowly, since that requires winning a seat (the 3rd) that would have a pretty small Democratic tilt. In an election cycle that favors Republicans, Democrats would likely find themselves with just three seats in this plan. And they could still conceivably wind up with just two in a very good Republican year.

There is virtually no political scenario under either plan where Democrats could win more than four of eight seats. And there are scenarios under both plans where they wind up with just two, though that's far more likely under the GOP plan. In that sense, both maps give the GOP a higher ceiling (six seats) and a higher floor (four seats) than Democrats have.

This reflects the GOP's natural geographic advantage: because the state's Democratic voters are disproportionately concentrated in Dane and Milwaukee counties, Democrats are at a disadvantage outside those two blue bastions. This means that giving Democrats an equal chance to win half the state's congressional seats in 50/50 Wisconsin would require spreading the voting power of Dane County and the city of Milwaukee across multiple districts. The commission's plan takes a step in that direction by extending the 1st District into the city of Milwaukee but still leaves Republicans in a more advantageous position.

How many people would be moved into a different congressional district under each plan?

The commission plan is a bigger departure from the current lines than the GOP plan. That's not surprising. Republicans are far happier with the current lines than Democrats are.

Under the GOP plan, a little more than 6% of Wisconsinites would find themselves in a different U.S. House district, according to an analysis by Johnson, of the Marquette Law School. Under the commission plan, 28% would.

How do these two plans affect competition?

There is not a lot of competition under either plan. To a significant degree, that reflects the fact that while Wisconsin in the aggregate is politically purple, many regions within the state are distinctly red or blue, so there are parts of the state where it would be very hard to draw a 50/50 district.

There would be at least six uncompetitive seats under both plans: the 2nd, 4th, 5th, 6th, 7th and 8th. But the commission's map creates a little more competition than the GOP map. While both plans feature a competitive 3rd District, the 1st District would be more competitive under the commission's proposal than it is now and than it is under the GOP plan.
